The class was explained about the way of handling interns in different companies and what does the company expects from the intern students. He also shared his own experience in his career as HR. The session was very helpful as the students got an idea about the manufacturing company's expectations.

On 24<sup>th</sup> June a guest lecture was organized to provide an insight on do's and don'ts in manufacturing internship. The session started with the prayer song; welcome address followed with profile of guest speaker.

His session started with a question what is the do's and don'ts in manufacturing internship and what we as students must compulsorily learn from industry. He also mentioned some questions to be asked to the company as well as Human Resource department. He pointed some important aspects that have to be carried out such as the code of conduct, safety measures, and work timings, use of technical gadgets inside company and reading of the company manual or the book that is given by the HR. He explained all the concepts that were related to our internship using practical examples with the help of incidents that took place in company.

Then in the second half, he dealt about the "campus to corporate" where in the concept was as an HR internship student how you can proceed from your campus to corporate campus and also what is expected from HR student in the company. Then he presented a video that showed the difference between fixed mindset and growth mindset. There were lot of comparisons discussed when we have fixed and growth mindset. He also advised to be open minded in asking questions. There were certain aspects such as register updates/ books, standing orders, time office, administration, transport, canteen rules and regulations, acts that are followed in the company.

There were certain laws and acts that were discussed like model standing orders, POSH act and company story and its profile. Certain points that lead to think and act were also discussed through interaction of students. New concepts such as master of learning responsibility, conduct vs misconduct in trade unions, shop floor schemes and feedback, total employee involvement. There were lot of quotes that made us think regarding our duties and responsibilities. Some important concepts of accountability were also learnt.

It was really an eye opening session as the students got an idea on all the possible career options they have after graduating with a bachelor's degree, other than those regular professional courses, bank


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exams etc., along with the benefits of the course and the preparation method to become a certified professional.


# **Talent Management and OD interventions:**


8. Detailed Report of the Programme

Foldscope is the ultra-affordable, paper microscope. Designed to be extremely portable, durable, and to give optical quality similar to conventional research microscopes (magnification of 140X and 2 micron resolution), Foldscope brings hands-on microscopy to new places!

It was developed by Manu Prakash of Stanford University. It is part of the "frugal science" movement which aims to make cheap and easy tools available for scientific use in the developing world.

Our students have become a part of this initiative and have been actively uploading images in microcosmos.foldscope.org. As an activity of the Triple Helix, Dr.D.Uthra and 10 Foldscopers from our Department conducted Foldscope assembling workshop on 27.08.2019. Around 50 students of I B.Sc. The participants were very excited on hearing the description of Foldscope by the trainer. At end of the session, they clarified the doubts about foldscope.



- 2. Sample processing:
  - a. Processing of pure culture
  - b. Processing of environmental samples
  - c. Processing of food samples
- 3. Growth enrichment of Enterococcus faecalis in samples
- 4. Preparation of Genomic DNA
- Multiplex PCR assay preparation
- 6. PCR assay programming
- 7. PCR assay results interpretation

The participants were given hands on training on the rapid detection of pathogenic Enterococcus faecalis in the water samples obtained from diverse sources such as water samples microbial sources. Overall, the training programme was successfully conducted and it was very useful for the post graduate students of Biotechnology. The feedback of the participants were collected and analysed. 



- An airport is a gateway to a city. If the airport works, it becomes easy and
  pleasurable to visit the metropolis for business or pleasure. A city's airport is a
  first impression and a last impression that a visitor carries.
- Airports allow global companies to establish operations in multiple cities and have managers and executives travel seamlessly between locations.
- The importance of airports as global business hubs is now being recognized globally. In some parts of the world, entire cities or at least fully-functioning suburbs (with office space, industrial buildings, and residential and retail districts) are being built around airports.

From a tourism perspective, places with airports especially good airports attract visitors and promotes both leisure travel and MICE.

4) Airport Structure and Layout: Basically the structure of any airport is designed as Airside

and Landside

The landside of an airport includes parking lots, public transport, railway stations

and access roads. This is that part which is accessible to the general public.

The airside of an airport refers to the part of an airport used by the aircraft for takeoffs and landings and loading and unloading. This is the area beyond security

check, customs and is strictly guarded by the airport authorities.

5) Components of an Airport:

a. Runway: A runway is the area where an aircraft lands or takes off. It can be grass or

any hard surface such as asphalt or concrete. Runways have special markings on them

to help a pilot in the air to tell that it is a runway and for landing purposes.

b. Terminal Buildings: Also known as airport terminal, these are the spaces where

passengers board or alight from flights. These buildings house all the necessary

facilities for passengers to check in their luggage, clear the customs and have lounges

to wait before boarding.

c. Aprons: These are the areas where the aircraft park. These are also called ramps.

They vary in size from areas that may hold five to ten planes, to very large areas.

d. Taxiway: This is the path on an airport connecting runways with ramps, hangars,

terminals and other facilities. They mostly have hard surfaces.

e. Aircraft Stand: A portion of an apron is designated as a taxiway and intended to

provide access to aircraft stands only.

**f.** Control Tower: Here air traffic is controlled and observed by radar.

g. Parking: This is the area where vehicles park.

6) Regulatory Bodies:

6.1 The Airport Authority of India (AAI)

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It is the AAI that manages 125 airports which includes 18 international airports, 7 customs airports and 78 Domestic airports in India. Its main functions include construction, modification and management of passenger terminals, development and management of cargo terminals and improvement in all airport infrastructure. Airport security also comes under AAI.

6.2 The International Civil Aviation Association (ICAO)

The ICAO aims to foster the planning and development of international air transport to ensure safe growth of civil aviation around the world and encourage the art of aircraft design and operations for peaceful purposes and encourage development of airways and airports.

7) Air Traffic Control (ATC): Air traffic control (ATC) is a service provided by ground-based controllers who direct aircraft on the ground and through controlled airspace, and can provide advisory services to aircraft in non-controlled airspace.

 Air Traffic services help in navigating aircraft while landing, take off, flying in the air, over flying any country, taxing on the ground and parking

• They provide a discipline in the air and also on the ground and maintain safety.

The services are provided by using modern equipment including radars.

8) A Brief on the Rajiv Gandhi International Airport, Hyderabad

 The Rajiv Gandhi International Airport (RGIA) has been adjudged as the third best Airport in the world in the 5-15 MMPA categories in Airport Service Quality by Council International (ACI).

"PG & Research Dept. of Biochemistry - Neuberg crew, D.G Vaishnav College, Arumbakkam" organized an International webinar on Fragile-x syndrome- myths & facts of EC matrix of brain on 23rd May 2020 via the Google meet and YouTube live platforms. The webinar started at 04:00 p.m. The session started with the introduction of the speaker. Dr. Venkat completed his master's degree at the Dept. of Biochemistry, D.G Vaishnav college (Alumni), went on to pursue his Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D) at CLRI, Chennai, Now, currently a Postdoctoral Research fellow at Weizmann Institute of Science, Israel. He talked about the Extracellular matrix (ECM), what it is composed of and it's important functions. He talked about, skin- as the largest organ, role of dermatopontin in re-epithelialization; a key event in wound healing and any impairment that is associated with various pathological conditions, immunolocalization of dermatopontin in skin. He delivered a brief description about angiogenesis, it's location (where it occurs) and it's vital role in wound healing process. He also very well explained about the assays viz, scratch wound assay, tube formation assay, chick aortic arch assay. Then, went on to explain about the extracellular matrix of the brain, Fragile - X Syndrome - leading cause for autism, social interaction and social novelty analyses, synaptosomes (to study neuronal proteins), how to identify substrates etc. He mentioned the process of - reprogramming fibroblasts to induced pluripotent stem cells. In the end, he summarized his entire lecture. The participants came up with amazing questions which were dutifully clarified by the speaker Dr. Venkat Raghavan Krishnaswamy. 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

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

## **Definition: Organizational Development**

Mr. M. Kailasagiri started the session with the definition of organizational development "Organizational Development refers to a long-range effort to improve an organization's problem solving capabilities and its ability to cope with changes in its external environment with the help of external or internal behavioral-scientist consultants." Interventions are sets of structured activities in which selected organizational units engage in a series of tasks which will lead to organizational improvement. The intervention

is the procedure the Organizational Development consultant uses, after diagnosing an organizational situation and providing feedback to management, to address an organization problem or positive future. It is the function of the HR to make sure there is improvement from one level to another by having structured milestones and effective monitory systems.

## **Types of OD Interventions:**

- Strategy for Business
- Process OD
- Human Resource OD

Strategy for Business growth is basically divided into Organic and Inorganic business growth. Organic growth is the growth a company achieves by increasing output and enhancing sales internally. Inorganic growth arises from mergers or takeovers rather than an increase in the company's own business activity

Process OD processes a number tools namely Total quality management, Toyota production system, Six Sigma, Total employment involvement, and Total productive maintenance. It is highly essential for the employee to understand the requirement and the production process in case of a manufacturing company. In order to improve the process from one level to another the company must understand what they want first. As the future HR's it is highly essential to be thorough about two basic OD techniques in order to help the employees and make them understand in a better manner.

## **Human Resource OD Interventions:**

Mr. M. Kailasagiri explained three OD interventions:-

## Performance Management System

It consist of two components SMART GOAL and MANAGEMENT BY OBJECTIVES . A Smart goal is used to help guide goal setting. Management by objective attempts to align personal goals with business strategy through increased communication and shared perception between managers and subordinates.

Mr.M.Kailasagiri also explained about how Performance Management System will be effective and useful. He also explained about the Key results area that should be done in a smart way. It should be realistic and achievable

## Training and Development

Changing the skills and knowledge of organization members to improve effectiveness and build capabilities. Mr.M.Kailasagiri said that the HR should know the skills required to perform the job and access the employees capability and the give training. Skill Matrix is a visual tool that shows the task and skills required for specific roles and the current competency and skill level of each employee for each task mapped against the required competency or skill level. Mr.M.Kailasagiri also explained about the types of Development plans.

## Competency Development Plan-

It identifies competency proficiency strength and gaps. The plan is designed to work on activities in order to leverage strength and develop in areas where employees is not as strong.

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Individual Development-

It is a tool to assist employees in career and personal development. Its primary purpose is

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to help employer reach short and long term career goals, as well as improve current job performance.

## HR OD Interventions: -

Mr.M.Kailasagiri explained three Interventions and how they are coordinated with Organisational Development.

## Hi Pots Development Process

There are three stages in Hi Pots development process -

- 1)Approach Stage
- 2) Deployment Stage
- 3) Results Stage

## **Career Pathing**

There are three steps in career pathing

1) Aspiration 2) Assessment 3) Achievement

## **Critical Position and Succession Planning**

There are three process- Identification of Critical Position

Validation with Functional Heads and finalize Critical PositionValidate using CEB tool-Critically and Retention Outlook.

## **Question and Answer:**

## 1) How to get a better understanding of on-the job training?

A: On-the job can be understood better only by getting experience over a period and through experiential learning.

## 2) What is the difference between individual and collective plan goals from the training perspective?

A: In order to achieve organizational development, one must understand the employee completely. When everyone in the organization knows and understands it results in group development

## 3) Does talking to individual employees essential?

A: It is fundamentally correct to take individual opinions from the employees of the organization and it results in self-assessment. It results in a better difference.

## 4) Difference between Skill mapping and Competency mapping

A: Generally, Skill mapping is done for the blue-collar workers and competency mapping is done for the white-collar workers. But they may vary as it depends on one company to another.

## 5) Do we need to know all the tools of OD?

A: It is not compulsory to know all the tools of OD, but one must be aware of the tools for better understanding of the employees which will lead to Organizational Development.

6) Which is the most important element in HR subject-wise?

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Valzhnav Collega Arumbakkam, Chennai - 600106. A: In terms of the subject, one must have a clear understanding in OD paper in order to become a good HR and in terms of a HR professional, he should be available for the management to implement change, and also play link-pin role in order to help employees better.

## 7) How does Competency Mapping work?

A: An individual must sit with the functional heads to find out the key competencies and also must map the subsets such us selecting source evaluating them, interviewing the candidate etc.

## 8) Why is communication so important

A: India is a diverse nation which consists varied cultures and languages. But English is a language which unifies all as one, so it is essential to know the English language to communicate better

## 9) What can the Organization do to motivate them on a longer run?

A: Fun activities like organizing birthday parties is not engagement process. It cannot retain the employees for a long run.

## 10) How often should a company give promotions or hike for an employee's?

A: Promotions should be given only when an individual in ready to handle higher role.
